In Class Procedure at a Glance

It is often difficult to get students to change partner. Queues are a simple and relatively fast way to assign partners for a pair work activity, and also give practice in question forms. The outcome can be random if cards are distributed randomly or can be 'fixed', often useful for ensuring separation of students with shared mother tongues.

1. Make **two** copies of the cards sheet.
2. Cut one copy up into cards. **Keep the other as a reference.** There are 18 cards on the sheet. If your class is smaller use the reference sheet to make sure you give out the first 12, 14, etc. To 'fix' the queue write students' names on the back of the card you want them to have and then mix up the cards.
3. (Optional) Whole class brainstorm on areas (and postcodes) of Dublin.

4. Tell the class they were in a queue yesterday. Give them out one card each at random or fixed by you and tell them to reassemble the queue by asking other students **“Do you live in..?”** or **“Where do you live...?”**
5. When the queue has formed tell them that they are working in pairs and their partner is the person beside them in the queue.
6. (Optional) Partners tell each other about where they really live in Dublin, their favourite/least favourite part of the city, etc.
